



EXTREME COLD WEATHER

Keep in mind that during extreme cold weather

All Employees should:

- 1. Bring and wear their entire uniform including insulator and hat
- 2. Wear extra layers underneath their uniform
- 3. Bring a change of very warm socks
- 4. Wear neck gaiters, insulated gloves, and appropriate footwear
- 5. Advise and help ensure all guests loading lifts or in ski school are dressed appropriately
- 6. Look for the signs of frostbite on guests and fellow employees: white patches on skin, hard or waxy-looking skin can develop in one chair lift ride or ski/ride down. To resolve you will need to cover and warm area. Keep area covered after that.

Managers and Supervisors should:

- 1. Ensure your facility, office, or shop is secured from the cold (check to make sure windows and doors are shut and latched). Maintenance protocols have been completed to prevent frozen pipes where needed.
- 2. Make sure all employees are properly dressed and are on a rotation to allow for warm-up breaks when applicable.
- 3. Monitor employees for the signs of frostbite.
- 4. Inform foot passengers on lifts and other guests of proper attire for these conditions.
- 5. Anticipate any other potential effects extreme cold weather may have on your Line of Business.
